# OUR LEARNING THIS TERM

## Weather

With all the different types of weather we have been experiencing recently the children have had many discussions about what they can see in their local environment. The children have been observing the weather in our nursery outdoor environment, creating pictures to represent what they have observed. As it has been rather cold during the past month the children have also been investigating any ice or frost in the garden and talking about how to be safe as it can often be slippy.

## Castles

Some of the children have recently been using our junk modelling resources to build castles, which started a greater interest in investigating castles. We have been exploring the castles we have around Scotland and the different parts of castles when they were built. The children have also started to explore different types of flags and have been designing their own. We have recently started a Floorbook to show our learning about castles, please ask a member of staff to have a look. If you have ever visited a castle with your child, please let us know by adding it to our planning wall in the cloakroom, speaking to a member of staff or emailing the school office if you can't make it in to nursery.

#### Story Sacks

#### Children's clothing

Please ensure <u>all</u> items of clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name (including spare changes, coats, outdoor shoes etc.). Indoor shoes should be placed in your child's blue/red drawstring bag at the end of each session as the shoe boxes are shared. Any clothing items found without a name will be put in our lost property box in the cloakroom. We will empty these at the end of each term.

#### Spare Clothes

Please ensure your child has a full set of spare clothes in their nursery bag in the cloakroom. With the wetter weather and outdoor play we are running low on some of our spare clothing items. We would appreciate any donations of socks, pants, trousers and leggings in all sizes.

#### <u>Outdoor Play</u>

Children will have access to outdoor play in all weathers. Please ensure your child comes to nursery in weather appropriate clothing, for example, wearing a waterproof jacket and wellies on wet days.

We continue to promote independence at our nursery. You can help at home by encouraging your child to independently change their shoes and put on their coat.

## Update of information

Please remember to inform a member of nursery staff as soon as possible if any changes occur to the following: Emergency contact details / Address, phone number or email address / Pick-ups /Personal circumstances affecting nursery / Permissions e.g. photography / Medication or allergies

## <u>Absence</u>

If your child is unable to attend Nursery, please contact the school office prior to the session on that day to inform them of the absence. Please note that if your child is suffering from sickness and/or diarrhoea they must be absent from school for at least 48 hours after their symptoms have cleared.

## <u>Allergies</u>

As we have a number of children with severe allergies please do not bring your own food or drinks into nursery (including in bags in the cloakroom) as this compromises the risk assessments we have put in place to safely meet the health care needs of all children. If your child does require to bring any food or drink to nursery (e.g. lunch for going to a child minder) please hand it in a clearly labelled lunchbox to a member of staff to be kept in our kitchen area.

## <u>Medication</u>

If your child requires any medication please speak to a member of staff as we require a form to be completed. If your child is bringing medication to nursery, please hand it to a member of staff. Medication of any kind should not be left in the cloakroom.

## Winter Ready

In the event of our school being closed, West Lothian Council will provide updates on school closures through Groupcall, local media and radio stations, such as Radio Forth and Real Radio. The West Lothian Council website, Twitter and Facebook page will also provide severe weather warnings and relevant updated information. In the event of our school being closed, learning will be supported through the use of our Glow blog, which staff will update regularly with activities which the children can do at home.
