Updates

Staffing

- The school have unfortunately been experiencing a high level of staff absences, there has been improved access to supply teachers this school year thanks to the council
- Recruitment is underway for two permanent class teachers (received 56 applications!), as well as pupil support worker and nursery nurse posts
- Lunch times clarification, since things have changed a little post-covid:
 - Children get 45 minutes, which includes eating and playing.
 - Some classes play before eating, whilst some eat straight away
 - If you feel your child is not eating enough, reach out to the school and the staff can monitor your child.
 - There is a board in the hall that says when the year group may leave the lunch hall to play (minimum 15 mins to eat before going out to play) but children are always welcome to stay as long as they want in the lunch hall.
 - No children are ever rushed out of the hall.

SeeSaw

- Is meant to be a one way communication tool for teachers to share updates to parents
- Parents are struggling when having more than one child using SeeSaw, parents are having to log out and log back in to access different profiles.

Communication

- Currently email, group call, SeeSaw/Teams and the new school app are being used to communicate with parents. This will reduce to the School App for general communications and SeeSaw/Teams for class information/homework once all parents are using the School App.
- For parents to communicate with teachers, email is preferred. This stops teachers
 receiving work notifications out-with their working day, allows the school to monitor
 frequently asked questions and helps to reduce the risk of overloading teachers.

Fundraising events

- The Halloween Disco raised £507. Thank you to all who supported us on the night!
- o The Halloween Trail was a great success. Money is still to be totalled.
- Upcoming other things: Calendars, Christmas Cards, Tea Towels, Christmas Fayre

Finances

- The Credit Union scheme is being looked into as a way to help parents manage money across the various fundraising events and costs of school activities
- We're looking into sourcing money out-with the parent forum through community sponsorship for things such as leavers hoodies, year books and school trips.
- PVGs are going to be offered to some parent helpers in the coming months
- Christmas Fayre will be on Saturday 3rd December, 10:30-1pm. The organisers would like everyone to be able to join to celebrate the first in-person Christmas fayre post Covid, so have made the decision to make the event free entry to support the reduction in pressure on parental finances, and will share costs of activities in advance so parents know what to expect on the day.
- The school welcomes used books though politely ask that the books are recent so as not to
 potentially include dated gender and racial stereotypes.
